# BRAC OVERVIEW



- ✓ Estimated Construction = 7.9 million square feet
- ✓ Dollars = \$1.6 billion
  - Medical = \$1.4 billion
  - Non medical = \$135 million
- ✓ Army Modular Force = \$62 million
- ✓ **Note:** San Antonio BRAC construction total is \$2.23B over six years;
- ✓ MILCON norm for area is \$65-\$100 million per year
- ✓ Growth = 11, 500 personnel
  - Family members = 5, 800



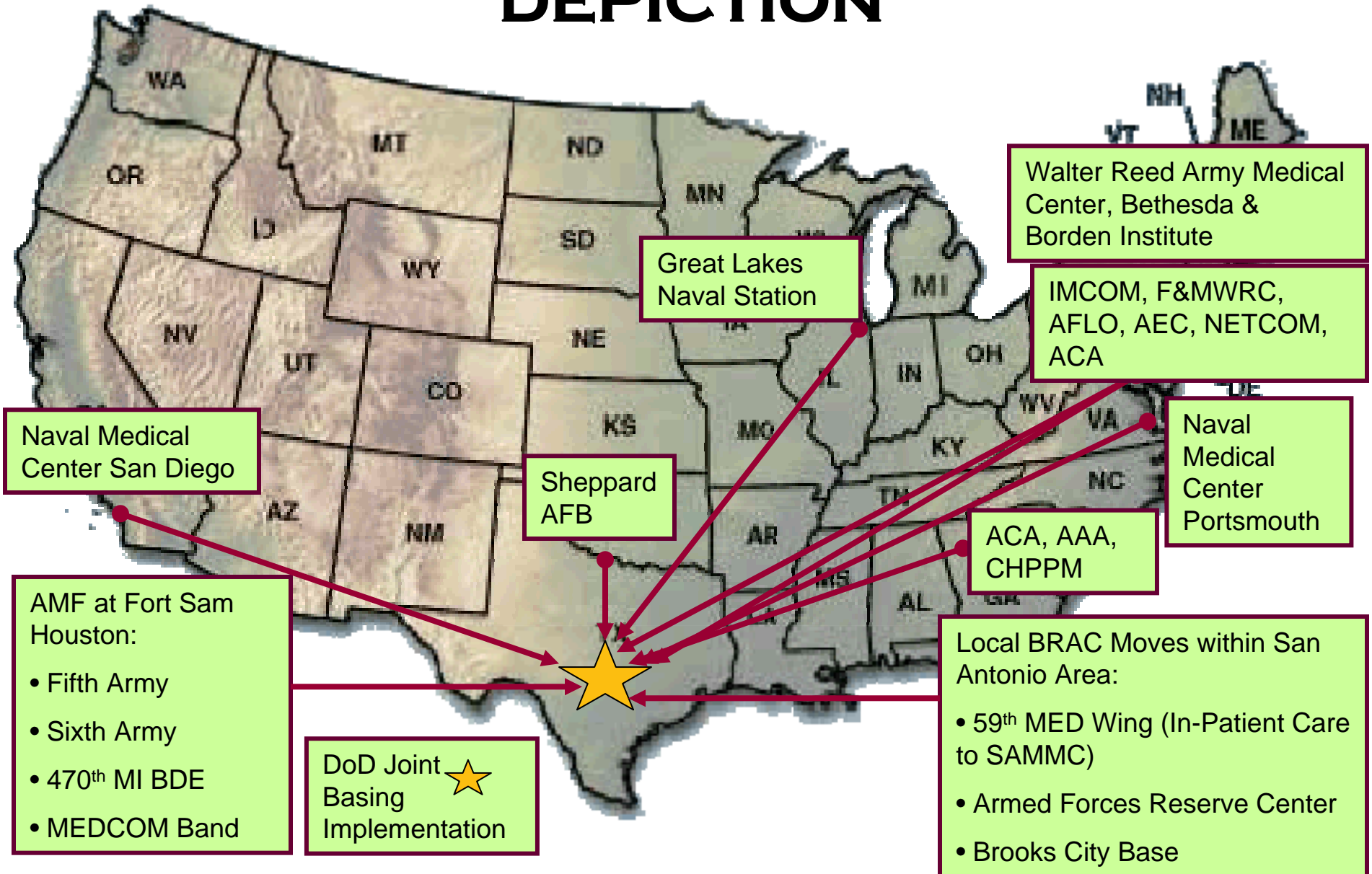
# TODAY AT AMEDDC&S

- 26, 058 resident students per year
- 255 courses taught each year
- 87 multi-service training programs
- Students represent 75 allied countries

## Air Force

- 73 total courses
- Average daily student load = 1667
- Maximum student load = 2375
- Inbound from Sheppard AFB
- Note: 13 courses are inter-service

## Navy

- 29 total courses
- Average daily student load = 2700
- Maximum student load = 3032
- Inbound from Portsmouth, San Diego and Great Lakes
- Note: 11 courses are inter-service

  - Average daily student load over 9000
  - Faculty and staff over 3600
